

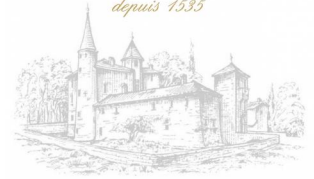

ESTATE

The Château de la Terrière has stood in Cercié since the 16th century, in the heart of the Beaujolais region. It is one of the oldest estates in the region. The vines cover a total of 28 hectares and are 50 years old on average. They extend due south, to the mid-slope of a granite hill. The aim of Frédéric Maignet, who is in charge of the château, is to give the wine enough time to fully develop its expression and reflect the complexity of the terroir.

SOIL

The 6 hectares of vines located in the Pierres Dorées region in the south of Burgundy, in clay and limestone soil.

VINIFICATION & AGEING

Burgundy vinification method with maceration for about 20 days. Aged on fines lees, partly in casks and barrels (1 to 3 wines).

TASTING NOTES

A very delicate nose with aromas of cherry, strawberry and blackberry. Full-bodied in the mouth with silky tannins.

FOOD & WINE PAIRINGS

Grilled red meat, duck and terrines.

VEGGIE : Green beans and broccoli.

Integrated crop management

SERVING TEMPERATURE from 15 to 18 °C
